

When will Cyprus join Schengen?

Cyprus' original goal of joining by **end-2026** is no longer realistic.

Due to delays in migration infrastructure, digital systems, and the political approval process, the timeline has shifted.

Even under an optimistic scenario, accession is now expected in 2027.

Key reasons for the delay:

- The **Limnes migration center** will not be fully operational until spring 2026.
- Cyprus must complete **EU-required digital border systems**.
- Final entry requires **unanimous approval** from all Schengen states, followed by a **6-month adaptation period**.
- Broader political factors (including U.S. visa-waiver negotiations) also influence timelines.
